What is CAP/C?



The Community Alternatives Program for children (CAP/C) is a program for disabled, medically fragile children, ages birth to18, who are at risk of being put in an institution.

Services Include:

- Case Management
- In-home Aide or Nursing Services, based on level of care needed.
- Respite Care
- Home Mobility Aids

Regular Medicaid services like:

- OT, PT, ST, RT Therapies
- Medical Equipment & Supplies
- Home Infusion Therapy
- Nutritional Supplements by mouth

What is CAP/DA?

The Community Alternatives Program for Disabled and Elderly Adults (CAP/DA) offers an alternative for elderly and disabled persons who are facing possible placement in a nursing facility, but who wish to remain living in their own homes...



A social worker and nurse work with the client and his family to develop a care plan to meet his special needs. CAP-DA services help maintain the client's health, safety and well being.

To be eligible you must:

- Be elderly or disabled and have an intermediate or skilled level of care requirement.
- Be 18 years of age or older.
- Be eligible for Medicaid.
- Live in a private residence and be at risk for institutionalization, or live in a nursing facility and desire to return to a private residence.
- Choose CAP/DA services instead of facility placement or regular Medicaid services. Your care must not exceed CAP budget limits.
