

- * Conducts holistic & comprehensive assessments
- * Recommendations to the courts

✓ Alcohol Drug Services (ADS)

- * Drug screening & assessments
- * Report findings to the courts

✓ Guilford County School System

- * On-site teachers, EC teacher and Transition Coordinators
- * Core subjects taught (Math, Science, Language Arts & Social Studies)
- * Grades are transferred back to the home school



Mandated Requirements

- 1. Provide temporary housing/placement
- Pending legal action
- Disposition
- 2. Provide/ assist with necessary treatment
- Substance abuse
- Mental health
- Community placement
- 3. Supervision (State Requirement)
- Staffing (1 staff/ 8 juveniles)



✓ Juveniles are admitted to the facility, pursuant to Court Order.

- <u>Delinquent Juvenile</u> Any juvenile who
 - While at least 10 but less than 18 years of age
 - Commits a crime under state law or local ordinance
- Undisciplined Juvenile While at least 10 but less than 18 years of age
 - Is regularly disobedient to and beyond control of parents or
 - Is regularly found in places where it is unlawful to be or
 - Has run away from home for more than 24 hours

While at least 10 but less than 16 years of age

Is unlawfully absent from school



House Bill H593

- Juveniles that are 16 18 years of age can be confined for the following reasons:
- Pretrial confinement
- Active sentences for misdemeanor offenses
- Probation sanctions
- Contempt orders






- √ The average stay for a juvenile is between 14 and 28 days.
- ✓ Boundover juveniles average stay is between 1 to 3 years.
- ✓ Average ages range from 10 to 18 years of age.
- ✓ Juveniles are here for a variety of different crimes ranging from Runaway to 1st Degree Murder.


143B-530 State Subsidy

- 143B-530. State subsidy to County detention facilities.
- The Department shall administer a State subsidy program to pay a County that provides juvenile detention services and meets State standards a certain per diem per juvenile. In general, this per diem should be fifty percent (50%) of the total cost of caring for a juvenile from within the county and one hundred percent (100%) of the total cost of caring for a juvenile from another County. Any County placing a juvenile in a detention facility in another County shall pay fifty percent (50%) of the total cost of caring for the juvenile to the Department. The Department may vary the exact funding formulas to operate within existing State appropriations or other funds that may be available to pay for juvenile detention care. Budget Drivers

Mental Health Reform

- Group home closings statewide
- Lack of mental health emergency beds (hospital)
- Increased mental health juveniles admitted
- Increased training needs for staff to work with special population
- Direct impact with staffing patterns to handle proper supervision required
